

## **SCFC Incident Management Team ACCOMPLISHMENTS 2006-2017**

The SCFC first initiated an Incident Management Team (IMT) in 2006. The goal is to eventually have a fully qualified Type 2 IMT. In order to meet this goal, many National Wildfire Coordination Group (NWCG) training courses were taken followed by some rigorous team training. This is an ongoing process as individuals take specific position courses and the team continually involves itself with various exercises and events. Some of that training involved exercises and on-the-job training on actual assignments that have been done over the past 12 years and are listed below. This will give you an idea of the scope of the IMT and its expectations especially outside the agency.
